MATERIALS

- Rocks, garden statues or ornaments, holiday ornaments, used toys, balls, flower pots
- Acrylic Paints
- Paintbrushes

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Invite your neighbors to participate in the creation of a Community Sculpture Walk.
2. Instruct participating neighbors to find an item that they can paint. Items can be those listed above, or other creative items that they have around the house or can find in nature.
3. Paint the items with acrylic paints and paint brushes. Let dry.

OPTIONS ON THE FOLLOW PAGE

Option A

Once your neighbors have painted the items and let the items dry, arrange for one person, or a couple of people, to collect the painted items.

Scatter the items around the neighborhood along safe walking routes. Write down where you placed each item so that you can remember to collect the items in the future.

Create a hand-written or printed map or instructions of the walking route where your neighbors can spot the Community Sculptures. Indicate on the map how many sculptures your neighbors can find, and let them know where to look for those sculptures. Distribute the map or instructions to your neighbors.

Option B

Once your neighbors have painted the items and let the items dry, arrange for one person, or a couple of people, to collect the painted items.

Scatter the items around the neighborhood along safe walking routes. Write down where you placed each item so that you can remember to collect the items in the future.

Create a hand-written or printed map or instructions of the walking route where your neighbors can spot the Community Sculptures.

The precise locations of the sculptures are secret! Make this into a game by telling your neighbors how many sculptures they can find along the walk, and let them try to spot the sculptures themselves.

Distribute the map or instructions to your neighbors.

Option C

Once your neighbors have painted the items and let the items dry, ask them to place the item in a visible place where passersby might be able to see the sculpture.

Let your neighbors know to look for these sculptures on their daily walk!
